



## The Pearl by John Steinbeck (F) Available at Delsea


#### To Sir, With Love by E.R. Braithwaite (F) Available at Delsea

When his efforts to reach these troubled students are met with threats, suspicion, and derision, Braithwaite takes a radical new approach. He will treat his students as people poised to enter the adult world. He will teach them to respect themselves and to call him "Sir." He will open up vistas before them that they never knew existed; and over the course of a remarkable year, he will touch the lives of his students in extraordinary ways, even as they in turn, unexpectedly and profoundly, touch his.




#### Never Cry Wolf by Farley Mowat (F) Available at Delsea

Contact with his quarry comes quickly, and Mowat discovers not a den of marauding killers but a courageous family of skillful providers and devoted protectors of their young. As Mowat comes closer to the wolf world, he comes to fear with them on onslaught of bounty hunters and government exterminators out to erase the noble wolf community from the Arctic.

Eventually, the pair learn to deal with their past and each other in ways that are humorous, entertaining, and life changing.




# I Am Number Four by Pittacus Lore (F)

#### Stuck in Neutral by Terry Trueman (F)



To the world, Shawn's senses seem dead. Within these pages, however, we meet a side of him that no one else has seen—a spirit that is rich beyond imagining, breathing life.




#### 13 Little Blue Envelopes by Maureen Johnson (F)


# Carmen by Walter Dean Myers and Ross Workman (F)


# Theodore Boone: Kid Lawyer by John Grisham (F)

As her father struggled to recover from a breakdown and slowly resurrect his career, Louisa learned to support her family, teaching if she must, but finally finding her vocation in writing. This story of their tense yet loving relationship adds dimensions to Louisa's life, her work, and the relationships of fathers and daughters.
